MEMORIES REWIND

Apart from fleeting drive-throughs on the way to Mussoorie or Haridwar, I hadn't stepped foot on the campus since the Convocation. I was hoping against hope that it would still be the same as I remembered.

As we drove through the Century Gate, I was swept away by the majesty of the Main Building our totem sign, the Taj Mahal of our campus. With the E&C Tower looming in the background, the colonial structure of the Senate Hall brought back all the happy memories. It was as if years just melted away and I was again a freshman joining UOR in the heady summers of 1989, lost on the teeming campus hopeful of my future!

We sped through the campus to catch up with our batchmates at the old Afro-Asian Hostel (now the Khosla ka Ghosla). Many had come in the previous day, many more were trickling in. We would almost be at full strength by evening. Old friends and batch mates some near and dear and some just acquaintances were all greeting each other and catching up on each other's lives in a cacophony of noise. Though it was a challenge remembering some names, all was forgiven in this wave of bonhomie. Memories were refreshed, pulling up instances of our antics and high jinks, trying to recapture the freshness of our youth, we reminisced on how young we were and how free our minds were!

The afternoon was spent retracing our steps in our old haunts the departments, classrooms, labs, catching up with our old professors! After the heavy educational stuff, it was time for some fun and games like the good old days, at the UG Club or just chilling at Satkar or the various cafes sprinkled across campus. More excuses to chill and yak it up.

One of the highlights by the organizers was a movie show at the Hangar however, it was a damp squib owing to technical difficulties ("Any engineer out there to fix this mess"). Nonetheless, we were all able to take nostalgic trips through the concerts we had all rocked out to there.

Groups set off to sample the epicurean delights on offer in the city and compare to the meagre offerings we had in our time. Thankfully, our Electrical Batch had put together a much smarter and well catered do, where our smaller cohort let our hair down and had a great evening of song and dance.

I woke up early the next day as I was keen to do a walking tour of the campus and savour every inch of the campus. I walked from Bhavan to Bhavan, from Mess to Mess, checking out the clubs, roving through the Main Building offices, traversing Lovers Lane and Raj Path. I knocked on the doors of my old rooms and chatted up with my descendants, commiserating that it does get better. I even went to each Bhavan canteen to partake in my old favourites special half maggi, bun omelet, and banana shakes. Sadly, the taste didn't quite match the memories I had of them.

The most surprising to me was the presence of a Gift Shop, with T-Shirts, mugs, key chains on offer. Capitalism had finally come to Roorkee. I feel they missed a trick by not having wares with "University of Roorkee, Roorkee" plastered on them.

With all the happy memories, there were some gloomy moments. I was taken aback by the over-construction at Ganga blocking off the views. The clothes hanging for drying at Cautley reminded me wistfully of the gentle dhobis (where would have they gone?). The state of disrepair of the classrooms saddened me. The dinginess of the washrooms made me wonder how I had managed to go back then.

A bunch of guys tried their hand at a game of cricket, trying to recapture their old form, cheered on loudly by the ladies. A sumptuous lunch was had at the Director's beautiful bungalow, tucked away tastefully from the students' prying eyes. Much opportunities were given for frank exchanges of ideas between the establishment and the alumni, with both wanting the best for this venerable institution, during the lunch and later at the Auditorium, rounding off with the communal singing of the Kul Geet with gusto.

The rest of day was spent in more entertainment and catching up of more memories, over more plates of food and glasses of drinks. We were all trying to cram in our memories of 4 years into these 2 days, trying to make sure that these intervening 25 years did not exist.

ABOUT IIT ROORKEE

The Indian Institute of Technology, Roorkee has developed a system to facilitate smooth driving and minimize accidents in foggy weather conditions. A team of researchers at the institute has developed an efficient architecture and algorithm to enable better driving experience in low visibility conditions. The objective of this research was to design a system for real-time defogging that produces a clear image stream from the input foggy frames. The collision of vehicles due to poor visibility caused by fog leads to numerous fatalities annually. This advanced defogging system will aid drivers by providing real-time information and minimize the risks of road and train mishaps due to fog, said IIT, Roorkee Director Prof. Ajit Kumar Chaturvedi.

A team of researchers at IIT-Roorkee has developed a disinfection box that can be used for sterilizing a wide variety of personal belongings including medical equipment, Personal Protection Equipment, apparels. This device will be a step forward in ensuring safety. Prof. Ajit K Chaturvedi, Director, IIT Roorkee has said that "It is easy to use and will be useful for disinfecting items in public places". The device has been developed by a team of researchers at IIT Roorkee led by Professor Soumitra Satapathi, Laboratory of Integrated Nanophotonics and Biomaterials. The team has already filed a patent for this innovation.

IIT Roorkee researchers find breakthrough for treatment against systemic candidiasis infection. Researchers from the Deptt. of Biotechnology, IIT Roorkee have demonstrated that vaccination using a fungal strain protein can protect against systemic candidiasis (*C. tropicalis*) infection in a mice model. The study by Manisha Shukla and Soma Rohatgi, has been published in the American Society for Microbiology journal.

IIT Roorkee along with three other Indian institutes and RIKA (a social entrepreneur) in India and Keio University and India-Japan Laboratory, Japan joined hands to organize Social Innovation Online Hackathon (SIOH). Other three Indian Institutes are IIT Hyderabad, VNIT,

Nagpur and NIT Durgapur. The event was held on 25th August 2020.

The objective of the hackathon is to find unique solutions to tackle unforeseen exigencies such as the COVID-19 pandemic and establish a resilient world in line with Sustainable Development Goals of zero hunger, good health and well-being, gender equality, clean water and sanitation, sustainable cities and communities and climate action.

The Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) and the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Roorkee on Wednesday, 19 August, signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to collaborate in the fields of civil, electrical, mechanical, chemical, earthquake engineering, development and management of water resources and renewable energy projects, infrastructure development, medical biotechnology and nanotechnology, biomaterials etc. Under the MoU, both institutes will collaborate in standardisation activity through technical committees, undertake R&D projects, organise seminars, conferences, workshops, and exchange publications and other literature of common interest related to Standardisation and Conformity Assessment among others. BIS will also extend financial support to establish a Chair in the field of Standardisation and Conformity Assessment at IIT-Roorkee.

INTO THE HISTORY

A recent post on spoken Sanskrit Language program organised by Sanskrit Club of IIT Roorkee motivated me to write down few lines about significant contribution made by the then Chancellor of University of Roorkee approx. Six and half decades ago. Sri. Kanhaiyalal Maniklal Munshi (popularly known as K. M. Munshi) had taken over the charge of Governor of U.P. in June 1952 and consequently he became the Chancellors of four Universities of U.P including Roorkee University. He was a great lawyer, legislator, scholar, educationist and therefore made significant contribution as the 2nd Chancellor of the UOR from 1953 to 1957.

He was a man of amazing enthusiasm and values, who firmly believed that the ancient Indian scriptures, and the culture reflected in them, were the great source of wisdom and knowledge from which we should draw inspiration to mould the future of Indian people. He also believed that the Universities should act as the temples of learning, culture and act as the laboratories for reintegrating National values to suit the needs of the society. During his tenure only, #Shramdan (Voluntary works by the students) was introduced to carry out construction activities in campus. The objective of the Shramdan was also to boost up the moral and motivate the people to understand the dignity of the labour.

It was Sri Munshi who had introduced somewhat long exhortation to the passing graduates at Convocation with a mention of #Sanskrit phrases from #Upanishad, with which the ancient Indian saints used to exhort their disciples at the end of their education in Gurukul system. Also the practice of giving a copy of the Bhagvad Gita to every degree recipient was introduced by him but this was stopped after fifteen years ie., 1970 or so !!









Indeed, a golden era of UOR!!
