- IIT Roorkee has been adjudged as the 'The Most Innovative Institute of the Year' for its innovation quotient, in the Confederation of Indian Industry - CII Industrial Innovation Awards 2020. The award ceremony was held during the 26th DST-CII Technology Summit. The award was presented by Prof. Ashutosh Sharma, Secretary, DST, Government of India, and Kris Gopalakrishnan, Past President, CII & Chairman, CII National Start up Council.
- The Second Endowment Lecture was organized by the Department of Water Resources Development and Management, IIT Roorkee, in the memory of Dr. AN Khosla, a renowned engineer and politician. He was the first Indian Vice-Chancellor of the University of Roorkee. Er. M.Gopalkrishnan was the keynote speaker at the program, and he presented his lecture on the topic "A New Vision for System of Water Governance in India." Er. Gopalakrishnan apprised that India's population would be expected to be around 1.5 to 1.8 billion by 2050; approximately 450-500 million tons of food grains would be required to feed them. He pointed out that India's total water consumption was 813 billion cubic meters in 2010, which would likely increase by 1447 billion cubic meters in 2050. Around 1447 billion cubic meters of water would be required for the irrigation sector only.
- IIT Roorkee has inaugurated a state-of-art Centre for Drone Research on the campus. The initiative has secured a seed funding of over INR 100 lakh from alumni of the 1994 batch. This centre is envisaged to evolve as a unique facility at the national level wherein state-of-the-art and frontier research would be conducted on several aspects of drone technology, including drone development, drone applications and anti-drone technology. It was inaugurated at a virtual ceremony that witnessed the august presence of Dr.V.K.Saraswat, Member, NITI Aayog and former Director-General, DRDO as the Chief Guest, Dr. R.K.Tyagi, a Distinguished Alumnus of IIT Roorkee, and former Chairman, Hindustan Aeronautics Limited and Pawan Hans Limited, Shri BVR Mohan Reddy, Chairman, Board of Directors, IIT Roorkee, Prof.Ajit K Chaturvedi, Director, IIT Roorkee, Prof.M. Parida, Deputy Director, IIT Roorkee,
- Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Roorkee organized a virtual workshop on water issues. The objective of the workshop was to improve the application of scientific and technical know-how for the benefit of society in this critical area. The workshop identified issues, problems and projects to explore synergies among various institutes to conduct in-depth research in this direction. The workshop was presided by Prof Ajit K Chaturvedi, Director, IIT Roorkee, and coordinated by Prof Arun Kumar, Department of Hydro and Renewable Energy, IIT Roorkee.

Both the organizations have agreed to continue the MoRTH Professorial Chair at IIT Roorkee to provide leadership in different areas.

Dr. Swati Mohan daughter of Er. P. S. Mohan B. E.(Elect.) 1971 working with NASA had a key role in NASA's recent Perseverance Rover Mission to Mars, the most advanced astrobiology rover ever sent to another world which landed safely on the floor of a vast crater, its first stop on a search for traces of ancient microbial life on the Red Planet.



Dr. Swati Mohan, the Indian-American scientist is the Mars 2020 Guidance, Navigation, and Controls (GN&C) Operations Lead. She led the attitude control system of Mars 2020 during operations. Besides that, she was the lead systems engineer throughout the development. She is the key communicator between the GN&C subsystem and the rest of the project's

teams. Her responsibility includes looking after the team, scheduling the mission control staffing for GN&C, and guiding the policies and procedures it uses in the mission control room.

According to NASA, Dr Mohan had emigrated from India to the United States at the age of 1. She grew up in Northern Virginia-Washington DC metro area and later completed her B.S from Cornell University in Mechanical & Aerospace Engineering. She went on to receive her M.S. and Ph.D from MIT in Aeronautics/ Astronautics. She has worked on multiple missions such as Cassini (mission to Saturn) and GRAIL (a pair of formation flown spacecraft to the Moon). She has worked on Mars 2020 since almost the beginning of the project in 2013 and is currently working at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory in Pasadena, CA.

IITRAA congratulates the Mohan family and Dr. Swati Mohan in particular for her success in the mission.

Ms. Bhavya Lal, grand daughter of Sh. S.K.Kumar B.E. (Civil) 1960 has recently been appointed as acting Chief of Staff at NASA. She is first Indian American to hold leadership position at the US Space agency. Her

role makes her responsible for the day-to-day operations of NASAHQ and she will work with the NASA chief and senior staff on strategy and policies.
